<p><i>Reader's Theater!</i> paste a script and allow a small group to practice!</p>	<p>Language Learning! Have the teacher record a video, and students can lower the volume more & more to read along.</p>	<p>Journalism! Reading a news script is a traditional, yet valuable skill.</p>	<p><i>Historical Reenactments!</i> Students can write or recite historical speeches.</p>	<p>Poetry Readings! Whether published or unique, moving text helps with rhythm.</p>
<p>Interview practice! Pre-load interview questions, pausing the system for answers.</p>	<p>ARTIST STATEMENT! TYPE AND RECORD FOR ART SHOW.</p>	<p>Debate Prep! Use teleprompter to display arguments and rebuttals during practice.</p>	<p><i>Creative Starters!</i> Teacher pre-loads ideas for students to help with sparking creativity.</p>	<p>Music Lyrics! Students love music and reading lyrics. Set the pace to the song and go!</p>
<p>Post Directions! Avoid teacher repetition. Type the directions several times and hit play on the big screen.</p>	<p>Character monologues! Write and perform character monologues.</p>	<p><i>Free Choice</i> ?</p>	<p>Time Management! A teleprompter and a timer can keep students focused on important info.</p>	<p><i>Letter/Sound Recognition!</i> Play a script of phonics instruction for students to follow along.</p>
<p>Sight Word Practice! Create a script of sight words, where the speed of the prompter can be adjusted.</p>	<p>Vocabulary Games! Pre-load clues, definitions, questions as a vocabulary review.</p>	<p>Reading Fluency! Record students while reading content.</p>	<p>Try Emojis! Pair text with emojis as cues for students learning a new language or concept.</p>	<p>Speech Therapy Post articulation drills, speech exercises, etc. to support students</p>
<p>Mnemonics to facilitate memorization. Repeated reading of moving text.</p>	<p>Augmented/ Alternative Communication for students to express their thoughts and engage in conversation.</p>	<p>Mindfulness Practices. Lead students through breathing or relaxation exercises.</p>	<p>Songs and Chants! With younger students, speed can be adjusted.</p>	<p>Read-Aloud Support! Paste read-aloud text into teleprompter so students can read along !:! with the teacher.</p>
